3.0 QUESTION PERIOD

There were no questions.

4.0 REPORTS FROM THE CHAIR & DG

4.1 Chair's Report:

The Chair presented her monthly report noting the following:

- Ministry meetings and activities;
- School visits and activities;
- Premier Couillard's visits to Laurentian Regional High School and Laval to listen to the communities. He was generous with his time with the students;
- As Chair, she had the opportunity to meet one-on-one with the Premier and was able to mention the school board's needs with respect to taxation, pre-kindergarten, Adult Education and Vocational Training, flexibility for the budget rules and growing the school community;
- The education budget is to be increased by approximately 4.5%, which translates into approximately \$600,000,000 for the education sector for support of pre-school, elementary and secondary schools, direct service positions, an allotment to better prepare parents and children for the transition from home to school, infrastructure and digital strategies;
- As a distinct and diverse community, the English sector has requested flexibility with the monies from the budget increase;
- The Ministère de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur (MEES) has been visiting various regions of the province to make announcements concerning the *maintien des bâtiments*. When the MEES was in Laval, it was announced that this school board will be receiving funding for 15 projects in Laval. Announcements for Laurentides and Lanaudière are pending;
- She met with the Ministre to discuss community concerns and the topic of taxation, once again. The
 Ministre noted that there will be no changes to school taxation for 2017-2018 but that a plan is being
 developed that will be implemented, hopefully, for the 2018-2019 school year;

• The next school elections are scheduled for November 4, 2018, which is one month after the provincial elections so there is speculation that the school elections will be pushed back.

4.2 Director General's Report:

The Director General commented on his monthly report noting:

- The new communication tool, *DG Connection*, is aimed at improving communications with school board employees and stakeholders by providing important news, messages, etc. This publication will provide information in a more expedient fashion;
- In spite of a recent university study that noted challenges of a pre-kindergarten program, the school board has applied for five additional pre-kindergarten programs for Grenville, John F. Kennedy, Joliette, Laurentian and Ste-Adele elementary schools. It is felt that this program is vital to the northern communities. The pre-kindergarten program at Rawdon Elementary School and Ste-Agathe Academy has had a positive impact on the students who have participated;
- His attendance at the Comité MEES-Partenaires representing the English Directors General to discuss
 recent and additional measures announced in the recent provincial budget to ensure that the English
 community is included. There will be investments in early literacy and numeracy, sports initiatives,
 healthy lifestyles, special needs and school perseverence for high school;
- Enrolment is a concern for this school board and all English school boards so strategies are being
 examined as to how to keep students at this school board when they transition from grade 6 to high
 school. Programs need to be kept viable and sustainable so creativity is essential;
- The Ville de Rosemère has donated a playground structure worth \$40,000 to McCaig Elementary School;
- Congratulations were extended to:
 - Mary Lazaris on being named as one of Canada's Outstanding Principals;
 - all students who participated in the Hydro-Québec Montréal Regional Science Fair;
 - Morin Heights Elementary School who participated in the Staples "2017 Superpower Your School" contest for eco-friendly initiatives. The school was one of 700 across Canada that entered and was selected as one of the 10 finalists that won \$25,000 to purchase technology equipment from the sponsor.

In response to a question from the Vice-Chair, the Director General noted that he has not seen the entire study on pre-kindergarten but it was conducted in over 200 pre-kindergarten programs in Québec. In order to find out if there were any English pre-kindergarten groups in the study, the school board would have to make a request to the university research department that conducted the study.

4.3 Electoral Divisions - Laval:

The Chair provided background information on the following resolution.

WHEREAS on March 17, 2015, the *Commission de la représentation électorale* ("The Commission") tabled its preliminary report regarding the boundaries of the electoral divisions to the National Assembly;

WHEREAS provincial leaders publicly opposed changes to the electoral ridings of Chomedey and Fabre;

WHEREAS Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board works in close partnership with our political counterparts in these very important territories to the English minority community and the English education community in Québec;

WHEREAS despite only having a margin of maneuver of plus or minus 25% and despite no provision existing in the *Election Act* to proceed in the following manner, the Commission allowed the electoral divisions of Abitibi-Est, Abitibi-Ouest, Bonaventure, Gaspé, René-Lévesque and Ungava to deviate even further from the minimum allowed by law so that these divisions have between 26.8 and 44.0% below the average number of voters proposed per division;

WHEREAS the deviation of plus or minus 25% used by the Commission de la représentation électorale du Québec creates a severe inequality in the weight of a vote where some divisions may have 70% fewer voters than others:

WHEREAS Article 15 of the *Election Act* stipulates that any restructuring of electoral boundaries must take into account the surrounding natural communities as being a representation of the electors;

WHEREAS the current proposal of the Directeur général des élections du Québec (DGEQ) divides the Laval Hellenic community at the heart of their community;

WHEREAS an alternative solution to the redrawn map for Chomedey and Fabre ridings, including the addition of a section of Chomedey North, bounded by Autoroute 440, Le Carrefour Blvd., Route 117 and the A-15, annexing the riding of Sainte-Rose, has been proposed and is acceptable to the Laval Hellenic community;

Commissioner Vicky Kaliotzakis MOVED THAT the Council of Commissioners of the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board hereby opposes changes to the electoral ridings of Chomedey and Fabre;

AND THAT the Council of Commissioners of the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board calls for the Directeur général des élections du Québec to reverse its decision regarding the redrawn of Chomedey and Fabre and consider the alternative proposed by the Laval provincial leadership;

FURTHER THAT a copy of this resolution be sent to the Premier of Québec, the leader of the Official Opposition, the leaders of the other parties at the National Assembly, the Members of the National Assembly within the affected ridings as well as to the Council of Commissioners of the Commission scolaire de Laval.

WHEREAS these games represent a unique opportunity to mobilize community members around a common objective and to make Laval's citizens proud;

WHEREAS organizing these games will enable Laval to obtain the necessary sports equipment;

WHEREAS this event will play a role in promoting the culture of Laval as well as its heritage, institutions and artists;

WHEREAS organizing these games will make it possible to implement a plan aimed at developing Laval's athletes:

WHEREAS these games will help to promote the importance of sports and physical activity among the citizens of Laval;

WHEREAS these games will make it possible to develop an expertise and set up a fund for organizing other events:

WHEREAS hosting these games is in line with the objectives of the Healthy Eating and Active Living policy of the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board;

WHEREAS the Ville de Laval and its partners have the necessary resources for hosting such an event;

6.3 MATERIAL RESOURCES

6.3.1 Renewal of Lease – CDC St-Eustache:

The Director of Material Resources provided background on the lease for CDC St-Eustache and answered questions and concerns:

- The school board gets a 68% return on GST and PST;
- Leeway is required in case the August opening of the Multi Service Centre is delayed as the school board still needs to have the time to vacate the current premises and return the space to its original state:

6.3.2 Renewal of Lease – CDC Vimont:

- Moving the CDC Vimont to another location has been examined and several locations have been visited over the past year and a request to the MEES for a new building to house the centre is being considered:
- The new lease allows for the school board to terminate the lease without penalty after three years of the five-year lease, if a more conducive location is found;
- Plans are being made with the Centre Director to have extra space available in peak periods until a long-term plan is developed;
- Commercial leases are usually not available for one year;
- Parking at CDC Vimont is an issue and the school board will have to speak with surrounding businesses to see if they would be willing to rent space in their parking areas;
- The Ville de Laval owns some of the property behind the building and was contemplating building a parking lot but has since changed its mind;
- The school board is looking to see if there is additional space to house the students at the current location as well as at other locations but there is no guarantee that the MEES will provide a subsidy for additional space;
- The owner of the other piece of land behind the centre will be approached to see if he would be interested in renting the land for use as an additional parking lot;
- An update on the parking situation at CDC Vimont will be provided at the next meeting.

WHEREAS the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board, the Commission scolaire des Affluents and the Commission scolaire des Samares have been in discussion about a common Centre for Vocational Training in Lanaudière where Stationary Engine Mechanics (DEP 5146 – Mécanique de machines fixes – in English) and future Vocational Training programs could be offered;

WHEREAS the MEES, in a letter dated September 7, 2016, has authorized a permanent card for the DVS 5646 - Stationary Engine Mechanics Program for the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board and a permanent card for the DEP 5146 - Mécanique de machines fixes for Commission scolaire des Affluents and Commission scolaire des Samares, respectively;

WHEREAS said letter also authorized funding for the programs contingent upon the three school boards signing a Partnership Agreement that would detail the manner in which space, equipment, revenues and costs would be shared:
